DOROTHY L. GOOSBY

Senior Councilwoman Dorothy Goosby has been fighting for voting rights for minorities on Long Island since 1988. She filed a class action suit against the Town of Hempstead in 1997. A judge ruled that Hempstead's voting-at-large system violated the Voting Rights Act. The Supreme Court has recently gutted this Voting Rights Act. In 1999 Dorothy Goosby was elected to the Hempstead Town Board. She was the first African American to serve on this Board.

This year Hempstead Town Supervisor Don Clavin declared that the Town Plaza is being renamed Senior Councilwoman Dorothy Goosby Plaza. The official ceremony was supposed to take place on June 6th. However, it has been postponed due to the COVID 19 pandemic. This is a tremendous culminating achievement for a woman born in Apalachicola. Florida.

OUR HEALTH

MEDICARE/EMBLEM HEALTH GLITCH

Emblem Health issued new medical cards with new ID numbers taking effect July 1, 2020. Your job was to give your doctors the new ID card when you first visited their offices after July 1st.

The problem is that there is apparently a breakdown in the way Medicare and Emblem Health communicate with each other regarding the new cards. In the past, doctors would send a request for payment for services rendered to a Medicare member directly to Medicare. After Medicare would determine what portion of the payment was allowable and pay 80% of that portion, it would send the request to Emblem Health to pay the remaining 20%. This process broke down after the new cards went into effect. Medicare, instead of sending the request to Emblem Health, sent it to Blue Cross. Because this provider handles hospital claims, it obviously did not cover the remaining amount of the doctor's request for payment.

This problem is systemic, as it has affected many of our Medicare members. CSA Retiree Welfare Fund Administrator Doug Hathaway has been in contact with Medicare and Emblem Health and was informed of the problem and they are working on correcting it. Even though CSA did not cause this problem, Doug will monitor the situation.

If you are experiencing the above-mentioned problem, call

Medicare and Emblem Health and inform them of your situation. The more people who call, the more pressure these two organizations will feel to resolve the problem quickly as possible.

If you get an incorrect claim do not pay it. Just notify Medicare and Emblem Health. Should you get an actual bill, contact the CSA Retiree Welfare Fund.

PREPARING FOR THE INEVITABLE

When a member passes on, because the member never discussed with the spouse what happens in that event, lucky spouses who call the CSA Retiree Chapter, are generally referred by Mark, to me. It's difficult to have to go over, on the phone, what must be done. But **YOU** should prepare for the inevitable by discussing with your potential survivor exactly what options (if any) you have selected for your retirement allowance and what choice you have made for your **TDA**, and better, keep a folder of the papers you filed with TRS when you retired. TRS will send the survivor forms, at least for the time being, until they migrate these to an on-line process. And knowing what choices have been made will greatly help me in advising the survivor as to how to proceed. So, here are some things you should do NOW and have ready when the time comes. Prepare a folder with the following information:

- 1. A copy of your retirement application. This will list what option you selected as well as any pertinent beneficiary designations you have on file.
- 2. A copy of the **"STATEMENT OF BENEFITS" LETTER** you received from TRS when they finalized your retirement benefits. This will also contain the above information.
- 3. If you didn't save your Statement of Benefits letter, call TRS **NOW** and request a replacement. They should be able to provide it. They will likely not provide a copy of your retirement application. If you can't get replacements, place a written note in the folder as to what option (if any) you believe you may have selected into this folder.
- 4. Place copies of any **"CHANGE OF BENEFICIARY" FORMS** you may have filed since retirement into this folder.
- 5. A copy of Mark Brodsky's telephone number with instructions for your survivor to tell Mark that you have passed away and request assistance.

Census 2020 (Reminder)

The US Census 2020 is about to close. The information gathered during the census affects everything from government funding to democratic representation. It is crucial for the census count to be as accurate as possible to ensure states receive their fair share of federal dollars and the correct number of representatives in state and federal governments.

The data collection started in March and will continue through <u>October 31, 2020</u>. You can answer the 10 census questions by phone, by paper survey and, for the first time, online.

Based on census counts, federal money goes to programs like Title l funds, school lunch programs, special education, career and technical education, school aid, public housing, senior centers, SNAP, Medicaid, roads and bridges, emergency preparedness and more. If you haven't already done so, please complete your 2020 Census at <u>my2020Census.gov</u> online or by calling 1-844-330-2020. If you complete your Census <u>now</u> by self-responding online or by phone with your Census ID, Census workers will not come to your door later.
